

June 28th ó Lucerne, Allmend

The final stage of the Super 7 Women's tournament took place in Lucerne under warm and sunny skies on June 28th. The Super 7 Series is the equivalent of the Swiss women's 7's Championship, which is held over 3 initial stages throughout the calendar year. Hosted by three different clubs, it allows the national team scouts to observe their potential players at one location on three different occasions. It also allows all the teams to get together to iron out any issues which have arisen throughout the regular season. The two previous stages occurred in Zurich in October 2007 and in Meyrin in March 2008. Each tournament winners and runners up received points which they carry over to the next stage.

Previous winners from stage 1 and 2 were Zurich and Lucerne with both being runners-up as well. Therefore, in the final stage it was down to the two big teams in Swiss women's rugby to challenge for the big Trophy, Lucerne benefitting from the home crowd and field. For 3rd place a little race between Cern and Yverdon was underway, with the better ranking team in Lucerne taking the Bronze trophy.

After a disappointing performance from Zurich in the qualifiers, the top trophy was easily secured by the home team, who win the 1st ever NSRV 7's Women's Championship. Runners up Zurich settled for 4th place in the tournament and surprise finalists Yverdon took the bronze overall trophy.

Congratulations to all the teams for participating in the 3 events and to the new teams who participated in one of the scheduled stages either in Zurich, Meyrin or Lucerne for the first time.
